PLI Discover PLUS Enhancements:

Viewing History

Do you like to stay organized when performing research on Discover PLUS? We recently added the Viewing History tab to our research management tools. This helpful feature captures the last 100 documents you viewed. If you get busy and need to backtrack and find that legal analysis you skimmed over or that M&A checklist you were reviewing, this feature will help you quickly locate it. Once found, you can add it to your bookshelf or email it to yourself.

Viewing History displays chronologically – and you can also sort alphabetically. If you want to check out your Viewing History, first select My History (located in the main navigation bar) and then select the Viewing History tab.

PLI Discover PLUS Search Tips: Looking for Archival Titles?

PLI has been expanding our Course Handbook archive. Our collection continues to grow as titles

are added each month – as of today we have titles going back to 2004.

If you are looking for older titles, one tip to find what you are looking for quickly is to go to the Browse tab on the main navigation bar.

You can use the date facets to focus on a specific year or years. And then you can use the Practice Area facets to further refine the list. For example, you can look at all the Tax titles from the year 2005.
