... So currently, it's still a big problem for the cannabis industry getting access to funds. You'll see in some states where cannabis is legal that the state created some sort of banking fix that enables local credit unions. It makes it easier for them to accept cannabis funds, but it's still an issue. ...

... For example, health benefits can never be discussed in cannabis advertising, especially recreational cannabis advertising, which is why you don't see cannabis companies going out and saying, this can help cure this disease, this can help treat this. They're just generally not allowed to discuss it. A lot of states have mandatory disclosures, and these vary widely by state. There are restrictions on the type of advertising. ...

... And I'll just mention again, this is different than cannabis. Cannabis companies, who are licensed by the state, are still allowed to sell edibles with THC. These rules are for companies who are not licensed cannabis dispensaries, like your local grocery store, who are now very severely restricted from selling THC products in these states. ...
